Lenny Farlee is an extension forester with the Hardwood Tree Improvement and Regeneration Center, Purdue University Department of Forestry and Natural Resources (FNR). Lenny graduated

from Purdue with a B.S. in Forest and Wildlife Management and a M.S. in Silviculture. He worked with the Indiana Division of Forestry at Vallonia State Tree Nursery from 1988 to 1991 as a Nursery Forester. From 1991 to 2006, Lenny was a district forester for the Indiana Division of Forestry. He served landowners in a 10 county area, providing advice and assistance with tree plantings, plantation and forest management, and forest improvement, harvesting, and regeneration.

In January of 2007, Lenny joined the Department of FNR where he provides programs and publications toward improving the regeneration and sustainable management of high quality hardwood trees.

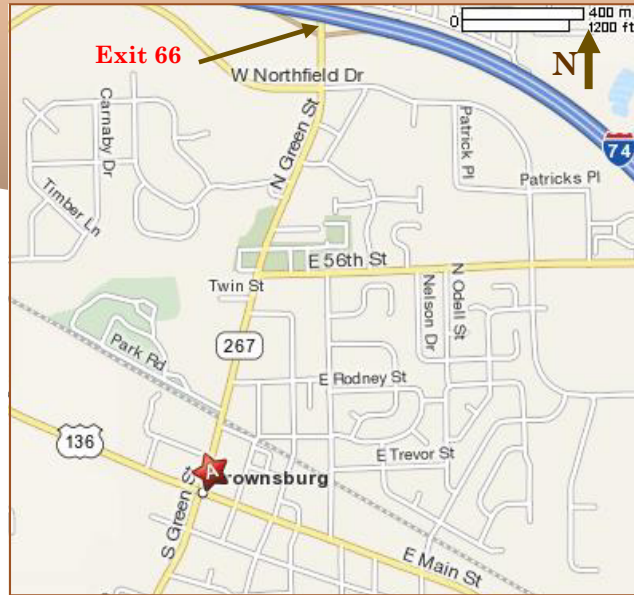
